

RESOLUTION NO. 55-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA, FOR ADDITIONAL REPAIRS NEEDED FOR THE DISCHARGE PIPELINE PROJECT AT THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$265,778.22 (ORIGINAL PROPOSAL COST OF \$162,500 PLUS VEOLIA 16.5% MARK-UP OF \$26,813, PLUS CHANGE ORDER COST OF \$70,151.58 PLUS VEOLIA'S 9% MARK-UP OF \$6,313.64)

WHEREAS, the City of Richmond's Wastewater Treatment plant has four (4) discharge pipes that transfer raw sewage, currently flowing at the rate of approximately 7-million gallons per day; and

WHEREAS, the underground Influent Pump Station to the above-ground Grit Removal Channel; the Influent Pump Station discharge pipes and Grit Removal Channel have been in continuous service since 1958; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond City Council approved the initial repairs to the Discharge Pipeline on October 2, 2019 by adopting Resolution 92-19; and

WHEREAS catastrophic failure of the discharge pipes will result in the uncontrolled discharge of overflowing raw sewage to the ground surface; and

WHEREAS, this could cause the treatment plant to violate its National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit resulting in potential fines and penalties by the Regional and State Water Quality Control Boards and (possibly) the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA); and

WHEREAS, while repairs are being finalized, the untold harm to public health and the environment could result in 7.0-million gallons per day of raw sewage reaching the ground surface around the WPCP and entering the San Francisco Bay; and

WHEREAS, during the latter half of this project to excavate and install a temporary 8" PVC sludge pipe line from the Primary Sedimentation Basin to the existing sludge pipe line located on the North side of the abandoned Sludge Control Building, it was discovered that the 4" water line and the 2" air-line also needed to be rerouted in preparation for the coming WWTP High Priority Projects and future demolition; and

WHEREAS, the current contractor, W.R. Forde, can perform this work as a change order to the existing contract. They will excavate and reroute the 4" water line from just outside of the Sludge Control Building and tie back in to maintain the process. W.R. Forde will then contract with Cisco Air Systems (Ingersoll-Rand Representative) to reroute the 2" air line for valve control, as Cisco Air Systems is the preferred Maintenance Company for the Plant Air Compressors; and

WHEREAS, this additional work to re-route the 4" water line and 2" air lines out of the existing Sludge Control Building is necessary to allow for the demolition of the Sludge Control Building to take place in a future contract; and

WHEREAS, the Discharge Pipeline project at the Wastewater Treatment Plant would be for an amount not to exceed \$265,778.22 (Original proposal cost of \$162,500 plus Veolia 16.5% mark-up of \$26,813, plus change order cost of \$70,151.58 plus Veolia's 9% mark-up of \$6,313.64); and

WHEREAS, the Contractor's proposal was reviewed by and agreed to by the City and Veolia; and

WHEREAS, the Water Resource Recovery Department issued a project Task Authorization to Veolia and Veolia Water West Operating Services, Inc. will manage the subcontracts with W.R. Forde; and

WHEREAS, these emergency repairs will not impact the adopted FY 2019/20, as the budget was amended at mid-year for the necessary funding for this project.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Richmond, as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and this City Council hereby so finds and determines.

Section 2. The Water Resource Recovery Department shall enter into a Contract with Veolia to manage on the City’s behalf subcontracts with W.R. Forde for the Emergency Repairs of the Discharge Pipeline Project for an amount not to exceed \$265,778.22.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
