**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND TO
ACCEPT A NEW FEDERAL GRANT AWARD PASSED THROUGH THE STATE OF
CALIFORNIA EMPLOYMENT DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND TO ADJUST
APPROPRIATIONS EXPENDITURES IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022
EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING DEPARTMENT BUDGET**

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of the City of Richmond fiscal year 2021-2022 operating budget, the Employment and Training Department was awarded \$250,000 from the California Employment Development Department Dislocated Youth Worker Innovation Challenge (DYWIC) Program funding, and

WHEREAS, the additional funding of \$250,000 will be used to provide Richmond residents who are participating in the State's Dislocated Youth Worker Innovation Challenge program with occupational skills training and on-the-job training opportunities, and

WHEREAS, this new grant will significantly expand access to training and job placement opportunities for Richmond residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Richmond that the fiscal year 2021-2022 Employment and Training budget is adjusted to add \$250,000 to revenue and to add \$250,000 to expenditures.
