**A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA,  
TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION  
EMERGENCY CONNECTIVITY FUND MONIES IF AWARDED INTO THE 2021-2022  
AND 2022-2023 LIBRARY BUDGET**

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Communications Commission created the Emergency Connectivity Fund in 2021 to cover the reasonable costs of laptop and tablet computers; Wi-Fi hotspots; modems; routers; and broadband connectivity purchases for off-campus use by library patrons; and

**WHEREAS**, staff at the Richmond Public Library applied for Emergency Connectivity Fund monies to support the expansion of device lending and connectivity for Richmond residents and library patrons; and

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Communications Commission has recently extended the period of covered service through June of 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Council of the City of Richmond that if awarded Emergency Connectivity Fund monies will be accepted and appropriated accordingly into the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 Library Budget.
