Re: Request for a Traffic Beacon at 15<sup>th</sup> Street and Macdonald Avenue

Dear Mayor Butt, Richmond City Council, and Joe Leach, Director of Public Works:

There are traffic intersections in the City of Richmond that are unsafe for pedestrians to cross the street. One such intersection located at 15<sup>th</sup> Street and Macdonald Avenue, has come to the attention of the Human Rights and Human Relations Commission (HRHRC) as being particularly dangerous, as there have been more than one accident at this site.

The HRHRC calls on the City of Richmond's Public Works department to consider this site for a pedestrian warning sign as well as a protective traffic control device better known as a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB). The RRFB is used in combination with pedestrian warning signs to provide a highly visible, flashing warning to drivers when pedestrians use the cross walk. Such a warning device is currently installed on Macdonald Avenue in front of the Richmond Senior Center.

It is HRHRC's understanding that an annual grant exists for funds for RRFB's and other traffic control devices, and therefore we strongly urge that the intersection located at 15<sup>th</sup> Street and Macdonald Avenue be included in the next crosswalk safety installation traffic control grant.
