

**RESOLUTION NO. 82-22**

**RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA,  
AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE GRANT  
SERVICE AGREEMENTS WITH NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THAT RECEIVED  
GRANT AWARDS FROM THE FY 2022-2023 ENVIRONMENTAL AND COMMUNITY  
INVESTMENT AGREEMENT (ECIA) FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWO-  
HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$225,000)**

**WHEREAS**, on July 29, 2014, the City of Richmond and Chevron Products Company entered into the initial Chevron Modernization Project Environmental and Community Investment Agreement (ECIA); and

**WHEREAS**, the ECIA was amended in August 2015 and December 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, the ECIA provides \$90 million to Richmond over a 10-year period (\$80 million in revenue to the City and \$10 million for a photovoltaic solar farm) and includes investments in community-based greenhouse gas reduction programs and various community programs, including but not limited to a competitive grant program; and

**WHEREAS**, \$6 million is allocated to fund the competitive grant program which was established to fund community programs and non-profits focused on community, youth, and youth sports; and

**WHEREAS**, \$375,000 is allocated for FY 2022-2023 for grant awards within four (4) grant categories; and

**WHEREAS**, in FY 2022-2023 there is a total of \$225,000 available to award in category 1 [organizations reporting gross receipts of equal to or less than \$50,000 annually (990N)] and category 2 [organizations reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000 annually (990)], with a minimum grant award of \$5,000 and maximum grant award of \$50,000, with a maximum of \$100,000 earmarked for organizations with annual budgets at or exceeding \$750,000; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 21, 2021, the City Council authorized the release of the “Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Richmond - ECIA Community Grant Program Guidelines and Application”; and

**WHEREAS**, eligible organizations were required to have 501(c)(3) tax status and provide services to Richmond and/or North Richmond residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the application was released on December 27, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, applications were due on February 13, 2022, and forty-six (46) organizations submitted applications totaling more than \$1.6 million in funding requests; and

**WHEREAS**, after review by City staff for completeness, forty-five (45) applications were forwarded for review and scoring by the Council-appointed ECIA Grant Review Committee; and

**WHEREAS**, the ECIA Grant Review Committee recommended to City Council that grants be awarded to the following ten (10) organizations, for a total award amount not to exceed \$225,000; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Council of the City of Richmond, California, adopts the Resolution to allocate FY 2022-2023 Environmental and Community Investment Agreement (ECIA) funds to the grantees in the amounts specified above, and authorizes the City Manager’s Office to negotiate and execute contracts with award recipients.
