**RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA,
ADOPTING THE REPORT ON SEWER SERVICE CHARGES FOR FISCAL YEAR
2022-2023 IN THE CITY OF RICHMOND PREPARED BY THE DIRECTOR OF
PUBLIC WORKS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 12.20 OF THE
RICHMOND MUNICIPAL CODE**

WHEREAS, on May 9, 1960, the Council of the City of Richmond adopted Ordinance No. 1662 entitled, AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND ESTABLISHING FEES FOR CONNECTION TO THE SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, FIXING AND ESTABLISHING CHARGES FOR SEWER SERVICES AND FACILITIES FURNISHED BY THE CITY OF RICHMOND, AND PROVIDING THE MEANS OF COLLECTING SAID FEES AND CHARGES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1542 AND ORDINANCE NO. 1645; and

WHEREAS, on May 27, 1971, said Council adopted Ordinance No. 13-71 N.S., which amended said Ordinance No.1662 (all of which is now known as Chapter 12.20 of the Richmond Municipal Code); and

WHEREAS, Section 12.20.060 of the Richmond Municipal Code requires that the Public Works Director cause a written report for each fiscal year to be prepared and filed with the City Clerk, which shall contain a legal description in the manner real property is described on the assessment roll of Contra Costa County, of each premise connected with the sewer system and receiving sewer service as of the first Monday in March preceding such fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2022, said Council conducted a public hearing regarding said report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Richmond hereby adopts the Public Works Director's report on sewer service charges for fiscal year 2022-2023, on file in the City Clerk's office, which lists the premises as shown on the tax roll in the County Tax Collector's Office which are receiving sewer service in the City of Richmond as of the first Monday in March 2022; and that said list also includes a description of each premise described in the same manner as set forth on the assessment roll of the City of Richmond, together with pertinent information as to the amount of sewer service charges and occupancy and use of each premise as shown on the tax roll in the County Tax Collector's Office.
