

**RESOLUTION NO. 167-22**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND,  
CALIFORNIA, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING THE PROGRAM  
NARRATIVE AND BUDGET AMOUNT OF \$6,000,000 FOR THE 2022-2025  
CALIFORNIA VIOLENCE INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION GRANT  
AWARDED BY THE BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Richmond’s Office of Neighborhood Safety (ONS) desires to participate in the California Violence Intervention and Prevention (CalVIP) Grant funded through the California State General Fund and administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (“BSCC”); and

**WHEREAS**, BSCC notified Richmond that ONS received the \$6 million three-year grant on June 9, 2022, which includes \$6 million in matching funds from the City of Richmond and participating community-based organizations included in the grant; and

**WHEREAS**, the ONS will provide violence intervention, prevention, and suppression activities services through a three-year grant. The grant will serve 535 youth in Richmond and West Contra Costa County through a local collaborative with RYSE Center, Richmond Police Activities League (RPAL), Social Good Fund, Evident Change and the Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP) in an effort to reduce violence through evidence-based programs and activities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Manager is authorized on behalf of the Council of the City of Richmond to sign the Grant Agreement with the BSCC, including any amendments thereof.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council (1) accepts and appropriates the expenditure plan associated with the 2022-2025 CalVIP Grant Award, (2) authorizes the City Manager or their designee the right to negotiate and enter into three-year contracts with RYSE Center (\$1,000,000), RPAL (\$1,150,000), Social Good Fund (\$1,000,000), Evident Change (\$300,000), LEAP (\$120,000), and Financial Audit Services (\$25,000), and (3) authorizes the City Manager or their designee to execute all budgetary and program amendments approved by BSCC, and any amendments of the aforementioned contracts.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the ONS agrees to ensure all matching funds required for the above grant are provided and abide by the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the BSCC.
