HISTORY

Beginning in the **Summer of 2010**, the **Recreation Department** provided **Pop-Up Recreation** at local parks where the **WCCUSD** provided **Mobile Free Lunch Units**.

Pictures from the **Pop-Up Recreation** site at **Lucas Park**, with Troy Porter, Program Coordinator who is now a Rec Supervisor and Rochelle Monk, who later became the Recreation Director.





Recreation Staff would lead the children and families in fun games and recreation activities in underserved parks that were not so close to our traditional community centers. Rec vans would show up with staff and equipment and provide recreation for about 2 hours until lunch was fully served.




