

RESOLUTION NO. 149-25

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND,
CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A
COOPERATIVE IMPLEMENTATION AGREEMENT WITH THE CALIFORNIA
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (CALTRANS) AND TO ACCEPT AND
APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR MULTI-SITE TRASH CAPTURE PROJECTS**

WHEREAS, the City of Richmond is subject to the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board's Municipal Regional Stormwater Permit (MRP), which requires the City to reduce trash discharges from its stormwater conveyance system to the Bay; and.

WHEREAS Provision C.10 of the MRP establishes trash load reduction benchmarks and compliance deadlines, and the City is currently out of compliance with its C.10 trash reduction requirements; and

WHEREAS additional trash capture capacity is necessary to meet permit obligations and avoid potential enforcement actions and penalties, and.

WHEREAS, Caltrans has agreed to partner with the City to design and construct four stormwater trash capture projects within City rights-of-way that also treat Caltrans highway runoff, thereby contributing to compliance with both agencies' permit obligations; and

WHEREAS, Caltrans will fully fund the design and construction of the projects under a Cooperative Implementation Agreement (CIA), and the City will assume long-term operation and maintenance responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, entering into this CIA and implementing these projects will provide significant progress toward meeting the City's C.10 trash load reduction requirements and demonstrate proactive compliance to the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Richmond as follows:

SECTION 1. The City Council finds that the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporates them herein by reference.

SECTION 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a Cooperative Implementation Agreement with Caltrans for the design and construction of four multi-site trash capture projects, and to accept and appropriate Caltrans funds in the amount of \$10,250,000 into the Public Works Department's Stormwater Program budget.

SECTION 3. The City of Richmond commits to the long-term operation and maintenance of the installed trash capture projects as required under the Municipal Regional Stormwater Permit and the CIA.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
