**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND  
AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF THE MEASURE J GROWTH MANAGEMENT  
PROGRAM COMPLIANCE CHECKLIST FOR CALENDAR YEARS 2022 AND 2023**

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**WHEREAS**, Contra Costa County voters passed Measure J in 2004; and

**WHEREAS**, Measure J renewed a half-percent sales tax used to fund various transportation projects and programs throughout the county; and

**WHEREAS**, eighteen percent of the Measure J revenues are allocated to local street maintenance and improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Measure J “return-to-source” funds are paid out annually to local jurisdictions if the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) finds the jurisdiction is following the Measure J Growth Management Program (GMP) established by Measure J; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Richmond will receive approximately \$2,120,278 in Local Street Maintenance and Improvement Funds (also referred to as “return-to-source” funds) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24 and FY 2024-25 next fiscal year if CCTA determines that the City is in compliance with the Measure J GMP; and

**WHEREAS**, CCTA evaluates Measure J GMP compliance through a checklist that is distributed to local jurisdictions every two years; and

**WHEREAS**, each jurisdiction is required to complete the checklist and submit it to CCTA for review and approval prior to receiving its return-to-source funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Richmond staff completed the Measure J GMP Compliance Checklist for Calendar Years 2022 & 2023, and the checklist demonstrates the City’s compliance with the Measure J GMP; and

**WHEREAS**, adoption of a resolution authorizing the submittal of the GMP Compliance Checklist does not constitute a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000, et seq.) (CEQA), as it does not have the potential to result in either a physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of Richmond has reviewed and considered the Measure J GMP Compliance Checklist for Calendar Years 2022 & 2023 and authorizes its submittal to CCTA.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the City Manager or designee is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the City, and in its name, to execute and deliver such other documents and to do such acts as may be deemed necessary or appropriate to accomplish the intentions of this resolution.
