

RESOLUTION NO. 82-11

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF \$103,581 FUNDS AWARDED THE CITY THROUGH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA'S CITIZENS' OPTION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY (COPS) PROGRAM AND THE JUVENILE JUSTICE CRIME PREVENTION ACT FOR SUPPLEMENTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

WHEREAS, the State of California has appropriated monies for the Citizens' Option for Public Safety (COPS) program and for juvenile justice programs specified pursuant to the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA); and

WHEREAS, the State Controller is required to allocate the COPS and JJCPA funds to each county that has established a Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Fund (SLESF); and

WHEREAS, the County of Contra Costa has established a Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Fund; and

WHEREAS, state law requires the County Auditor to allocate a certain percentage of the monies received from the State Controller to the cities within the county in accordance with the relative populations of the cities; and

WHEREAS, County Auditor has made the allocations for the 2011-2012 fiscal year; with the understanding that the allocations may still be reduced because of State budget constraints; and

WHEREAS, under the allocations, the City of Richmond is entitled to a maximum amount of the amount of \$103,581 for front line law enforcement purposes; and

WHEREAS, the State of California requires that the City Council hold a public meeting to consider the Police Chief's request for funding; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Police Chief has submitted to the City Council a request that the funds, which the City will receive under the allocations, be used for equipment and training costs.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Richmond that:

1. The City of Richmond shall accept the allocation of \$ 103,581 from the Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Fund (SLESF).
2. The funds which the City will receive are hereby appropriated towards equipment, overtime, and training costs.
3. The City Manager, or his designee, shall establish a Supplemental Frontline Fund Organization/Object Code in the Munis System for the deposit of the funds which have been allocated to the City of Richmond from the SLESF.
4. The Finance Director of the City of Richmond shall submit the necessary reports and summaries which are required by state law.
