

RESOLUTION NO. 57-13

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING EXISTING SERVICE CONTRACTS FOR AS-NEEDED ELECTRICAL CONSTRUCTION SERVICES FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$75,000.00 PER CONTRACTOR PER YEAR OVER A THREE YEAR PERIOD, OCTOBER 2011 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 2014

WHEREAS, the Richmond Public Works Department anticipate that several major electrical projects funded by various fund sources, and grants will require the use of Electrical Construction Services; and

WHEREAS, Richmond Public Works Department further anticipate that additional major electrical projects not currently scheduled will arise during the period October 2011-2014 that will require the use of Electrical Construction Services; and

WHEREAS, the project-by-project selection process for Electrical Construction Services can take up to six months and involve significant per-project contracting costs; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Public Works Department have demonstrated that the use of a pool of Electrical Contractor firms that have passed a competitive bidding process on an as-needed basis eliminates much of the delay and costs associated with project-by-project bidding; and

WHEREAS, in June 2011 the City issued a Request for Proposals for As-Needed Electrical Construction Services through the City's BidsOnline system; and

WHEREAS, twenty two firms received the Request for Proposal, of which four presented proposals; and

WHEREAS, the four proposals the City received were reviewed by a panel consisting of Public Works Director Yader A. Bermudez, Facilities Maintenance Superintendent Al Shanklin and Electrical Supervisor Cornell Hughes; and

WHEREAS, in evaluating proposals, the panel considered four criteria: (1) the relevant experience and strengths of each firm; (2) the organization of the firm, the availability of resources, and the firm's ability to meet project schedules; (3) the qualifications of the identified project manager and project team; and (4) the firm's ability to provide high quality customer service to the City and the community; and

WHEREAS, the panel accepted the proposals of two firms, finding that all have the technical expertise to perform the work required, and that each clearly demonstrated their understanding of the technical complexities and regulatory issues involved in implementing public capital improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, the two firms selected are:

Kray Cabling, Inc. (Richmond)
Republic ITS. (Novato)

And;

WHEREAS, each Service Contract with an approved firm would be for an amount not-to-exceed \$75,000 per contractor per year for a total of \$225,000 per contractor over the three year period with two one year options of \$75,000 from October 2011 through September 2014; and

WHEREAS, firms hired for these as-needed Electrical Construction Services will provide major electrical construction services as requested by the City; and

WHEREAS, firms on the list will be asked to submit proposals for particular projects; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Department will manage the contracts;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Richmond, California, hereby authorizes the Public Works Department to enter into Service Contracts for as-needed Electrical Construction Services, with the following firms for an amount not to exceed \$75,000 per contractor per year over the three year period October 2011 through September 2014:

Kray Cabling, Inc. (Richmond)
Republic ITS. (Novato)
