**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND
AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE AND APPROPRIATION OF \$81,644
AWARDED TO THE CITY THROUGH THE FY2016 COMMUNITY POLICING
DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM GRANT TO DEVELOP POLICE STOP-DATA
COLLECTION GUIDELINES**

WHEREAS, the California Department of Justice was awarded a grant through the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services to develop police stop-data collection guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Police Department was selected to assist in developing the guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the California Department of Justice will serve as the applicant FISCAL AGENT and GRANTEE for the federal funds awarded; and

WHEREAS, under the allocation the City of Richmond is identified as a SUBGRANTEE and entitled to a maximum of \$81,644 to assist in developing the guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the State of California requires the City Council hold a public meeting to consider the Police Chief's request for funding; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Police Chief has submitted to the City Council a request that funds, which the City will receive under the allocations, be used to reimburse any overtime costs in developing the guidelines.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Richmond that:

1. The City of Richmond shall accept the allocation of \$81,644 from the California Department of Justice.
2. The funds which the City will receive are hereby appropriated towards personnel overtime costs associated with developing the police stop-data collection guidelines.
3. The City Manager, or his designee, shall establish a Fund Organization/Object Code in the Munis System for the deposit of the funds which have been allocated to the City of Richmond from the FY2016 Community Policing Development Program grant.
4. The Richmond Police Department shall submit the necessary reports and summaries which are required by State law.
