

RESOLUTION NO. 67-18

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND ALLOWING THE CITY OF RICHMOND FINANCE DEPARTMENT TO LEVY THE PROPERTY TAX ROLLS OF BUSINESSES SUBJECT TO ASSESSMENT UNDER THE DOWNTOWN RICHMOND PROPERTY AND BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (DRPBID) ON THE ANNUAL 2018-2019 COUNTY OF CONTRA COSTA PROPERTY TAX ROLLS

WHEREAS, the Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994, Streets and Highways Code §36600 et seq. authorizes cities and counties to establish property and business improvement districts upon petition by a weighted majority of property owners within the proposed district and affirmative ballot; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the property owners subject to assessment, weighted according to the amount of assessment to be paid by each property owner, have petitioned the City Council to renew the Downtown Richmond Property and Business Improvement District (“DRPBID”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Constitution Article XIII D, ballots were mailed on May 23, 2017 to property owners within the boundaries of the DRPBID, and, among those ballots returned to the City, a weighted majority of the property owners within the DRPBID have approved renewal of the DRPBID; and

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2017, the City Council adopted resolution No. 84-17 renewing the DRPBID, approving the assessment formula and levying the assessment; and

WHEREAS, DRPBID is governed in accordance with a written Management District Plan (the “Plan”), pursuant to Streets and Highways Code section 36622; and

WHEREAS, the Plan sets guidelines for the DRPBID including the assessment rate, service plan, collection provisions and governance; and

WHEREAS, the Plan has been certified by a registered professional engineer and the original is on file with the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the City of Richmond has coordinated the collection of the annual assessment through an Interagency Agreement with the County of Contra Costa and forwards the funds to Richmond Main Street Initiative, Inc. serving as the administrator of the DRPBID; and

WHEREAS, the initial assessment was \$0.13 per parcel square foot per year for commercial parcels; and

WHEREAS, the initial assessment to parcels owned and utilized by non-profit housing agencies was \$0.06 per parcel square foot per year; and

WHEREAS, assessment rates are subject to an increase of no more than three percent per year; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Main Street & DRPBID Board passed a resolution on file with the City Clerk on June 21, 2018 that includes a determination and recommendation for a permitted 3% increase in the amount of the annual assessment beginning in fiscal year 2018-2019 and

WHEREAS, the adjusted assessment to the commercial parcel owner is \$0.134 per parcel square foot per year and \$0.062 for non-profit housing agency parcel owners; and

WHEREAS, the City charges 1% for the collecting and processing of these levies and the processing fee amount collected will total \$2,055.82 and

WHEREAS, the City's annual contribution to the DRPBID, for services provided to City parcels, will be \$35,303.96.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Richmond hereby authorizes the City of Richmond Finance Department to levy the property tax rolls of businesses including a 3% increase in the amount of annual assessments recommended by the Richmond Main Street & DRPBID Board, subject to assessment under the DRPBID on the annual 2018-2019 County of Contra Costa property tax rolls.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Richmond hereby authorizes the City of Richmond Finance Department to levy the amounts listed on the attached Exhibit A for the properties specified therein.

RESOLUTION NO. 1

DOWNTOWN RICHMOND PROPERTY BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (DRPBID)
3% INCREASE

AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION OF RICHMOND MAIN STREET INITIATIVE

RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A 3% INCREASE TO DRPBID ANNUAL ASSESSMENT BEGINNING FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019.

At a duly constituted meeting of the Board of Directors of Richmond Main Street Initiative, Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit corporation ("RMSI") held via conference on June 21st, 2018 the following resolutions were adopted:

WHEREAS, the RMSI Board of Directors voted to exercise the maximum annual increase of three percent to the DRPBID as stated in the 2018-2022 Management District Plan (MDP) for the operation of the DRPBID in the designated budgeted categories that require RMSI to obligate by signature, commit, and adhere to MDP guidelines as they relate to the DRPBID.

WHEREAS, the DRPBID funding sources listed above are available through "Property and Business Improvement District Law of 1994," which was signed into law by Governor Pete Wilson, which ushered in a new generation of Property and Business Improvement Districts in California; and

WHEREAS, RMSI participates and receives funding through the DRPBID this Resolution acknowledges and requests the approval via this Resolution to undertake a 3% increase to the DRPBID funding which is levied on downtown property owners by the Contra Costa County Assessor and dispersed by the City of Richmond Finance Department to RMSI.

WHEREAS, RMSI will utilize these funds for operations of the DRPBID in compliance with RMSI mission statement and the MDP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes RMSI to request a 3% increase for DRPBID and to accept those funds on behalf of RMSI.
