

**RESOLUTION NO. 73-19**

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND,  
CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE COOPERATIVE MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN THE CITY OF RICHMOND AND THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE FOR  
THE ROSIE THE RIVETER/WWII HOME FRONT NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK**

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**WHEREAS**, the Rosie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park (Park) was established in 2000 in order to preserve for the benefit and inspiration of the people of the United States certain sites, structures, and areas located in Richmond, California (Richmond), that are associated with the industrial, governmental, and citizen efforts that led to victory in World War II;

**WHEREAS**, the enabling legislation of the Park recognized the important connection between the Park and Richmond, calling for joint planning and coordination between NPS and the City of Richmond (City) for management of the Park. Subsequent to the establishment of the Park, both City and NPS have completed planning efforts which call for continued coordination and collaboration on the management of the Park;

**WHEREAS**, one of the unique aspects of the Park, as different and distinct from any other parks in the National Park System, is the fact that there is no NPS land or facility ownership. This fact makes it even more critical that City and NPS develop strong partnerships with the owners of Park's resources and assets in order to further the Park's mission;

**WHEREAS**, many of the Park's primary resources are owned and/or managed by City, while others are privately owned. The Park's resources include the Ford Assembly Building and Complex, Richmond Shipyard No. 3, World War II Worker Housing, Richmond Fire Station 67A, and the Rosie the Riveter Memorial at Marina Bay Park and other shoreline parks including J. Shimada Peace Memorial Park, Barbara and Jay Vincent Park, Lucretia W. Edwards Park, and Sheridan Observation Point Park;

**WHEREAS**, to facilitate the collaborative management of Park resources, NPS and City have developed a Cooperative Management Agreement to further these efforts;

**WHEREAS**, the commitment of funds in furtherance of the Cooperative Management Agreement is to be authorized by individual task agreements issued against the Cooperative Management Agreement (Task Agreements) identifying each project or group of projects, amount of financial assistance, key officials, and any other special term or condition applicable to the specific project; and

**WHEREAS**, by Agenda Report received in conjunction with this Resolution on July 23, 2019, the City Council has been provided with additional information upon which the findings and actions set forth in this Resolution are based.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council hereby accepts that the above recitals are accurate and have served together with the Agenda Report as the basis for the findings and approvals set forth in this Resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Council hereby approves the Cooperative Management Agreement and authorizes and directs the City Manager to take any and all actions necessary to implement the intent of this Resolution, including but not limited to the execution and delivery of the Cooperative Management Agreement.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Council hereby authorizes and directs the City Manager to negotiate and take any and all actions necessary to enter into the Task Agreements required per the Cooperative Management Agreement to commit NPS funds in furtherance of the Cooperative Management Agreement.


