94% ARE ALIVE

83% WERE NOT INJURED BY FIREARM

77% ARE NOT A SUSPECT IN NEW FIREARM ACTIVITY

The Operation Peacemaker Fellowship is an 18-month, non-mandated engagement specifically designed for those considered most likely to become a victim of gun violence within 6 months of being offered the Fellowship opportunity. The Fellowship is a developmental and trauma responsive approach to interrupting urban gun violence. The Fellowship intensively engages those at the core of firearm conflicts in urban neighborhoods. Fellowships are personalized and each utilizes seven (7) concentrated touch-points and is grounded in evidence-based practice. The Fellowship represents one effective/successful [public] health approach to ending urban gun violence. **In 2016, the ONS completed its 4th Fellowship cohort. Twenty-two Fellows were enrolled. Of the 22 Fellows after 18-months – 100% are ALIVE, 84% have not been injured by a firearm, and 76% are not a suspect in a new firearm crime since becoming a Fellow.**


